## LCIF Flood Relief

In September District Governor Jay Wells received notification that District 14-B received a grant from Lions Club International Foundation (LCIF) in the amount of \$10,000 to assist families who were affected by the flooding in mid August. The grant funds are used to provide vouchers to families to purchase food, clothing, cooking utensils and blankets.

DG Jay Wells and VDG John Frombach met with Millvale Mayor Vincent Cinski and Borough Manager Virginia Pucci to discuss plans for distributing the vouchers. They were most cooperative in scheduling the times for the diistribution. Arrangements were made with Don McGregor, Manager of the Wal-Mart store in the Waterworks Mall for residents to redeem the vouchers.

Distribution of the vouchers occurred on Monday, September 10 and Wednesday, September 26 at the Millvale Community Center. Lions Michael Quinn, Jim Keanevev, and Ron Tiedeman from the Elfinwild Lions Club, IPDG Jim Hartman, and VDG John Frombach worked in providing more than \$5,000 in vouchers to residents who had suffered losses in the flooding.

Maria Christina, Manager of the Millvale Satellite of the North Hills Community Outreach, has been very helpful in notifying residents. Arrangements are being made with North Hills Community Outreach to provide additional vouchers to residents during the next month.

This has been another opportunity for Lions to reach out to those in our community who have suffered from disasters.

To receive the "Proud Lion Award, you must accomplish the following five activities within a six-month period:

- Attend a Board meeting for your club.
- Visit another club.
- Participate in one club project.
- Attend a Zone, Regional, or District function.
- Invite an approved proposed candidate to the club as a guest.

After you have completed these five simple tasks, your Club Secretary must mail the card to DG Jay Wells. The cards for the "Proud Lion Award" are available from your Club Secretary.

You have several opportunities to attend a zone or district function within the next two months. The following functions have already been scheduled:

- Wednesday, October 17 – Joint Zone Meeting for Region 2
- Monday, October 29 – District Fall Rally
- Tuesday, November 6 – Joint Zone Meeting for Region 4
- Thursday, November 15 – Joint Zone Meeting for Region 1

All you have to do now is get started on your way to a "Proud Lion Award." We want to recognize you for being a proud Lion.

After you have invited an individual to join your club and have invited that person to your club, you are on your way to receive the "Proud Sponsor Award." After you sponsor the new member, then you must accompany your new member in accomplishing the following five activities within a six-month period:

- Attend a Board meeting for your club.
- Visit another club.
- Participate in one club project.
- Attend a Zone, Regional, or District function.
- Sponsor a new member.

What a way to provide your new member a great orientation to Lionism in your community. We hope that many Lions in District 14-B step up to be recognized as both a Proud Lion and a Proud Sponsor.

## Examine Your Club

Every good Lions Club has six basic characteristics. The more firmly these qualities are imbedded into the Club's operating structure, the more success and growth the Club enjoys, thereby becoming stronger.

The Membership Committee Chairman has the responsibility to thoroughly know these six steps. By understanding how they work and imparting this knowledge to both old and new members - *in any special way possible* - all Lions will get the inspiration they need to remain active and involved in the club programs.

These six steps are:

1. A major service activity that involves every member of your club.
2. A major fund raising project in which the community can participate and to which it can contribute.
3. A strong public relations program that provides a continuous, unending line of communications between all members of the club and between the club and the community.
4. Well organized club meetings that are stimulating, informative, and enjoyable.
5. A team spirit - a condition that exists when each member knows that he is an important part of an organization that is truly dedicated to humanitarian service.
6. Strong membership growth and development programs which provide immediate orientation and involvement of new members in the club projects and a continuing involvement of current members in club activities.
