ATTENTION SECRETARIES

Did you know that Lions Clubs International has changed its MMR reporting schedule?

Beginning April 2008, the Monthly Membership Report (MMR) that is sent to Lions International must be submitted to them by the following dates:

- ▶ If you send by US Mail, the report must be mailed so that it will arrive at LCI Hdqs by the **20th of the month**.
- ▶ If you send via e-mail, it is due by the **last day of the month**.

The reason for this change is that under the present reporting schedules, LCI membership data is always a month behind. The District form (M&A) should also follow the same schedule.

We still have MANY clubs that have not adjusted to the new schedule.

Information Technology Chair PDG Jim Hartman will send Email reminder to all Club Secretaries on the 25th of the month to those secretaries who make electronic reports. PLEASE DO NOT FORGET TO ALSO MAKE YOUR REPORT TO LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL !!!

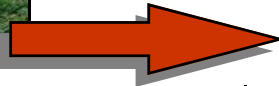
